EVENTS

JOBS/INTERNSHIPS

Since startups don't tend to hire 7 months in advance like big consulting and finance firms, this is one of our greatest challenges. In 2011-2012 we will approach this challenge along three dimensions:

- Information: sharing information on skills, roles, and timelines involved with finding a job or internship with a startup, including through newsletters, guest-blogs, and informational panels.
- Job postings: while we encourage companies to recruit through "official" HBS channels, we also list opportunities on the eClub website.
- Job fair: we plan to hold a startup job fair at the annual Entrepreneurship Conference in late February / early March 2012. We are inviting startup companies and VC firms to participate.

INDEPENDENT PROJECTS

2nd year HBS students may earn credit by working in groups or alone with outside companies. This is a great way to get talented students to help with valuable projects (for free!). The eClub is constantly searching for exciting opportunities to share with our members.
